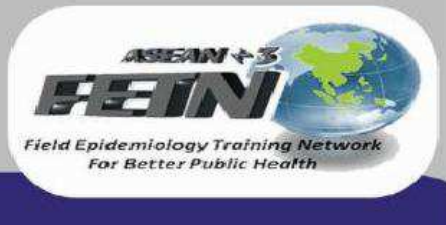
ASEAN+3 FETN NEWS
